Radio Net Procedures (EDT)

Calling the Long View Emergency Communications Group net, this is _____ and I will be your net controller this evening. This net meets each Friday evening at 7:30pm Eastern Daylight Time on the WA4DSZ VHF amateur radio repeater. The repeater's output frequency is 146.850 and it has a standard 600 KHz negative offset. No sub-audible tone is required to access the repeater. The net is open to all appropriately licensed amateur radio operators. The purpose of this net is to familiarize members with controlled net procedures and prepare for various emergencies. This is a directed net meaning you should address all traffic to the net controller. It is requested that all participants remain on frequency for the duration of the net. If you must check in and out, you will be given the opportunity to do so at the beginning of the roll call. Following the call for regular check ins, participants will be given the opportunity to make comments and announcements.
